Variety of trains and what they do are presented.

**IT'S FUNNY WHERE BEN'S TRAIN TAKES HIM** by Robert

Burleigh, 1999 [JP-B]

Ben draws a train that takes him to all sorts of wonderful places before returning him to his own bed.

**TWO LITTLE TRAINS** by Margaret Wise Brown, 2001 [JP-B] Two little trains, one streamlined, the other old-fashioned, puff, puff, puff, and chug, chug, chug, on their way West.

**CHOO CHOO** by Virginia Lee Burton, 1937 [JP-B]

A little engine decides it could be much faster without pulling all the other cars, so it takes off by itself.

**FREIGHT TRAIN** by Donald Crews, 1978 [JP-C]

Brief text and illustrations trace the journey of a colorful train as it goes through tunnels, by cities, and over trestles in this Caldecott honor book.

by Donald Crews, 2001 [JP-C TODDLER] Children slide open the doors to see what's inside each train car in this board book.

## **CHUGGA-CHUGGA CHOO-CHOO**

by Kevin Lewis, 1999 [JP-L]

A rhyming story about a toy freight train's day, from loading freight in the morning to retiring to the roundhouse after the day's work is done.

**THE OWL WHO BECAME THE MOON** by Jonathan London, 1993 [JP-L]

While riding on a train at night, a young boy listens and watches as he passes by many creatures in their wilderness homes.

## **TROUBLE ON THE TRACKS**

by Kathy Mallat, 2001 [JP-M] There's Trouble with a capital "T" lurking among the familiar faces as a train makes its way through the villages along its route.

**TERRIFIC TRAINS** by Tony Mitton & Ant Parker, 1998 [JP-M]

Rhyming text introduces a variety of trains as they leave a station, rush along the tracks, and arrive at the platform where travelers are waiting.

**MY PUFFER TRAIN** by Mary Murphy, 1999 [JP -M TODDLER]

As a penguin drives his train through the countryside, he picks up all different kinds of animals.

by Bill Peet, 1971 [JP-P]

Tired of being last on the smoky, noisy freight train, Katy Caboose wishes for some way to escape from the endless track.

## **THE LITTLE ENGINE THAT COULD**

by Watty Piper, 1930 [JP-P]

When the other engines refuse, the Little Blue Engine tries to pull a stranded train full of dolls, toys, and good food over the mountain.

**ALL ABOARD!** by Mary Lyn Ray, 2002 [JP-R]

Mr. Barnes goes on a train trip and enjoys all the sights and sounds of the ride.
